The mother dogs are not looked after, lacking good nutrition and veterinary care, and are mated every time they come into season. There are many owners who should not have dogs: they have neither the time nor the money to take them to training, and socialise and exercise them. These are the dogs that end up being a nuisance because they are stuck in the back yard and are thoroughly bored. 7. Exemptions from mandatory de-sexing will apply for health and welfare reasons as assessed by a veterinarian, and if the dog owner is a registered breeder.
