



Local Government Reform Stronger local democracy

The State Government is introducing the most **significant reforms of local government** in 25 years.

These reforms will strengthen the transparency, accountability, and efficiency of local governments, enabling stronger local democracy while ensuring a better response to the needs of ratepayers and residents.

Some of these reforms will have a direct impact on voting in the October 2023 local government elections.

Optional Preferential Voting (OPV)

Bringing local government elections in line with state and federal elections will result in making council more representative and responsive to ratepayers.
