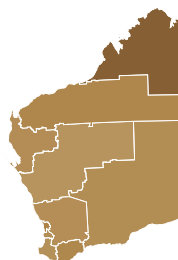

# Banned Drinkers Register (BDR) & Takeaway Alcohol Management System (TAMS) in effect in the Kimberley region



Everyone must present photo ID\* each time they buy takeaway alcohol in the Kimberley.



The BDR identifies people who are banned from purchasing takeaway alcohol and stops their purchase at the point of sale.



The TAMS records each purchase a customer makes and enforces daily purchase limits.



These initiatives aim to make communities safer by reducing access to takeaway alcohol for problem drinkers.



No personal details are recorded.

The effects of alcohol misuse are often felt by the most vulnerable in our community, such as children and families subject to domestic violence.



People identified as banned drinkers will be provided with details on how to access community services that provide support programs and initiatives.



The BDR and TAMS are tools designed to reduce alcohol-related harm to individuals, families and the wider community.



You can help with the transition by ensuring you are prepared and always carrying your photo ID with you when purchasing takeaway alcohol.
