

# How to place yourself on the Banned drinkers register (BDR) in the Goldfields

Apply for a voluntary banned drinker order (BDO) to put yourself on the BDR to help keep yourself, your family and your community safe.

## Getting a voluntary BDO is as easy as 1-2-3

Step 1: Download the application form at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/bdr

- Step 2: Fill in your details and other information
- Step 3: Email your application to bdr@dlgsc.wa.gov.au

Or you can also email your full name, date of birth, home address, mobile number, and a copy of your photo identification to **bdr@dlgsc.wa.gov.au**.

Applications are processed within two business days.

To remove yourself from a voluntary BDO, email **bdr@dlgsc.wa.gov.au**.

While on the BDR you cannot buy or have takeaway alcohol in your possession. If a friend provides you with takeaway alcohol, police can place them on the BDR.

**Remember** even on a voluntary BDO, police can seize and dispose of takeaway alcohol in your possession.
